

First Reading Jonah 3:1-5. 10

A reading from the prophet Jonah

The word of the Lord was addressed to Jonah: 'Up!' he said 'Go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach to them as I told you to.' Jonah set out and went to Nineveh in obedience to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was a city great beyond compare: it took three days to cross it. Jonah went on into the city, making a day's journey. He preached in these words, 'Only forty days more and Nineveh is going to be destroyed.' And the people of Nineveh believed in God; they proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least.

God saw their efforts to renounce their evil behaviour. And God relented: he did not inflict on them the disaster which he had threatened.

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 7:29-31

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians Brothers, our time is growing short. Those who have wives should live as though they had none, and those who mourn should live as though they had nothing to mourn for; those who are enjoying life should live as though there were nothing to laugh about; those whose life is buying things should live as though they had nothing of their own; and those who have to deal with the world should not become engrossed in it. I say this because the world as we know it is passing away.

Gospel Mark 1:14-20

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

After John had been arrested, Jesus went into Galilee. There he proclaimed the Good News from God. 'The time has come' he said 'and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News.'

As he was walking along by the Sea of Galilee he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net in the lake – for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you into fishers of men.' And at once they left their nets and followed him.

Going on a little further, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they too were in their boat, mending their nets. He called them at once and, leaving their father Zebedee in the boat with the men he employed, they went after him.

PPC UPDATE

Welcome all to the first update for 2024.

This weekend you will all notice that the first phase of the Sanctuary upgrade project has commenced. During the week a handful of dedicated volunteers responded to the call and came together to dismantle the sanctuary platform that had served well for three decades and to make way for the new expanded sanctuary which will be at a higher elevation. This modification helps reclaim additional floor space for more pews at the front to accommodate our growing attendances at services. You will also notice that the main crucifix has been repositioned and now looks down from the stained window and will be just above the new tabernacle position. The construction will progress over the next several weeks and the Parish Leadership team apologizes for any inconvenience caused. No liturgical services have been disrupted nor will they be until the entire new sanctuary has been completed. The completed sanctuary promises to enhance the spiritual experience of community.

Some years ago Mary Immaculate Parish commenced recognizing the rich ethnic and cultural diversity of our Parish community with the celebration of festive events relating to the various major ethnic community groups. The first such event for the year will be the celebration of the feast of Our Lady of Lanka, the patron Saint of Sri Lanka. The 10.30 a.m. Mass on Sunday February 4th will be celebrated in honour of Our Lady of Lanka – which also coincides with the 76th anniversary of the country's independence. A fellowship put on by our Sri Lanka brothers and sisters will follow after the Mass where Sri Lankan delicacies will be served. All are welcomed to come along.

The PPC promises to continue with the positive changes started in the last year and your continued support is solicited.
