Finding Christ in My Battle with Cancer

It all began with a painful foot. I thought it was just ordinary gout, but because the throbbing pain continued, I went to consult my GP. He sent me for a series of medical tests—an X-ray, scan, MRI, PET scan, blood tests, and a chest X-ray, all searching for answers to unexplained pain and discomfort. After a long and anxious waiting period, the final confirmation came through a biopsy: the bone cancer was caused by the diagnosis of Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma, an aggressive form of cancer that required immediate chemotherapy treatment.

Hearing the words "you have cancer" was something I never imagined I would face. It was difficult to admit that I have this physical problem, and even harder to accept it emotionally. As a priest, I am used to offering comfort to others in their moments of pain, yet suddenly I found myself the one in need of comfort.

When people began asking me about my diagnosis, I found the questions hard to answer. At times, they even irritated me not because I didn't appreciate their concern, but because each question reminded me of a reality I was still struggling to

accept. Resisting the situation didn't help my inner peace, so I turned to the only source of true consolation, my faith.

I began to spiritualize what was happening to me. I looked at the Cross and realized that this suffering is not just an affliction to endure, but an invitation from Jesus to walk with Him on His own journey of suffering. In uniting my pain with His, I found a new depth of prayer a quiet place in my heart where faith and suffering meet.

It has also been a great consolation to know that so many people are praying for me, my family, my friends, and my parishioners. Their love and prayers give me strength. I am humbled and grateful by your gesture. Each message, each prayer, and each small act of kindness remind me that I am not alone in this fight. Thank you!

On the 1st of October, I completed my second session of chemotherapy. The treatment continues every three weeks, and while the process is difficult, I hold on to the hope that God will continue to give me the strength to persevere. My greatest desire is to return to the altar, to celebrate the Holy Mass as usual with the people I serve and love.

In this journey of suffering, I have discovered that even in pain, there is grace. Even in weakness, there is strength. And even in illness, there is the unmistakable presence of Christ, who never leaves our side. Once again brothers and sisters thank you!



A reading from the second book of the Kings

Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, as Elisha had told him to do. And his flesh became clean once more like the flesh of a little child.

Returning to Elisha with his whole escort, he went in and stood before him. 'Now I know' he said, 'that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Now, please, accept a present from your servant.' But Elisha replied, 'As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing.' Naaman pressed him to accept, but he refused. Then Naaman said, 'Since your answer is "No," allow your servant to be given as much earth as two mules may carry, because your servant will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any god except the Lord.'
